



REGULATIONS CONCERNING THE SPORTS VENUE
- Football Stadium at Łazienkowska 3 Street, Warsaw

Pursuant to the provisions of the Law on Security of Mass Events of March 20, 2009 (Journal of Laws No. 62, item 504 as subsequently amended), it is decided as follows:

§ 1

The Stadium at Łazienkowska 3 Street, Warsaw (“**Stadium**”, “**Venue**”) is the registered office of the football club Legia Warszawa S.A. (“**Legia**”, “**Club**”).

§ 2

The Stadium is a venue which hosts massive sports events (include football matches), artistic and entertainment events, and other events.

§ 3

The detailed rules of conduct and availability of the venue to the public at the time of mass events are contained in the Regulations concerning Mass Events available at the headquarters of the Club and on the official website of the Club legia.com.

§ 4

On the day of mass event organized at the Stadium, the places for the public will not be accessible to outsiders from 8:00 a.m. until the start of the event (match). Entry gates will be opened to the eligible public at least two hours before scheduled start of the match. In certain reasonable circumstances the Club reserves the right to alter the rules regarding entry to the Stadium.

§ 5

If the venue is not scheduled for mass event, it shall be available according to the following rules:

- a) from 09:00 a.m. till 5:00 p.m. the office area of the venue is available only to the holders of the single entry permit or permanent passes, or to the persons authorized by the Management Board, or authorized personnel of Legia;
- b) from 5:00 p.m. till 10:00 p.m. there is possibility of supervised access to specified premises;
- c) from 10:00 p.m. till 9:00 a.m. only the persons who received the permission from the Management Board of the Club or the Security Director can remain within the perimeter of the venue;
- d) disciples of the Football Academy of Legia Warsaw from the youth teams can enter the venue on the basis of the identity passes issued by the Football Academy of Legia Warsaw; persons designated by them as guardians receive the right to enter into the area of training pitches;
- e) representatives of companies engaged in providing regular services, involved in repair and renovation activities within the area of the venue can be carried in or can enter on the basis of previously submitted lists of persons and vehicles;
- f) meetings, conferences, tours, groups visits to the Legia Museum and to the Stadium can be organized by prior arrangement concerning the time, conditions and type of visit with the relevant employee of the Club;
- g) brought/carried in and taken out/carried out valuables must be reported each time to the employee at the pedestrian or vehicles’ entrance to or exit from the venue.

§ 6

Media representatives have the right to enter the venue from 9.00 a.m. till 10:00 p.m., after presenting a press card issued by the given media organization and after obtaining the consent of the Press Office. The Legia Press Office should be notified in advance of any media representative’s visit to the venue. Entry to mass events is based on the accreditation issued by the Press Office.

§ 7

Trade, catering, servicing and artistic activities, as well as broadcasting, radio and television recordings, filming picture taking, etc. at the venue can be done only with the consent of the Club’s Management Board or an entitled employee.



§ 8

Carrying a weapon or other object which in the opinion of the organizer may present a threat to other persons, including bottles, cans, sticks, devices with mechanical drive, etc., explosives, fireworks, pyrotechnic materials, alcoholic beverages, narcotic drugs or psychotropic substances in the Stadium without the permission of the organizer is forbidden.

§ 9

The persons who are visibly under the influence of alcohol, narcotic drugs, psychotropic or other similar substances are forbidden to enter and remain within the Stadium.

§ 10

Each violation of these Regulations may result in an immediate ejection of a participant from the Stadium.

§ 11

The Management Board of the Legia Warszawa SA reserves the right to claim compensation for damages caused at the Stadium

§ 12

In case of violation of these Regulations or the Regulations concerning Mass Events, the Management Board of the Club may decide to initiate disciplinary proceedings against the fan who committed the violation, with the view of issuing the Club's Stadium ban, or taking other actions under the applicable law.

§ 13

The Club Management Board is authorized to change the rules on availability of the Stadium, of which it will inform in a generally accepted manner, including by the media, Internet, etc. or till the additional terms and conditions of the individual parts of the venue e.g. parking lot are established.

§ 14

1. The Stadium is monitored to ensure the safety of people (including Legia employees), to protect property and to establish and investigate or defend against claims. The legal basis for monitoring and the related processing of personal data is the legitimate interest of Legia, which is the administrator of the data collected as part of the monitoring.
2. The monitoring record is collected only according to the criteria of place and time of recording. Monitoring does not include functionalities that allow for automatic recognition of people or for indicating records with a specific person or vehicle.
3. The person whose data is processed has the following rights: the right to object to the processing of personal data; the right to access to personal data and obtain a copy of personal data; the right to rectify data, the right to erasure of personal data (the right to be forgotten) and the right to restrict data processing. 4. Moreover, each person has the right to a lodge complaint with the competent supervisory authority - in Poland, with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office if the person believes that the processing of personal data violates the law.
5. The data recorded as part of the monitoring will be accessed, apart from authorized representatives of Legia, by persons and entities providing the operation, maintenance and service of the monitoring system, entities providing IT support services to Legia, and security personnel. Monitoring records may be made available to law enforcement agencies, public authorities, including courts, insurers, as well as persons providing legal support services to Legia.
6. Personal data recorded as part of monitoring will not be transferred outside the European Economic Area or to international organizations.
7. Legia stores video surveillance recordings for a period not exceeding 3 months from the date of recording, unless the monitoring data constitutes evidence in legal proceedings or Legia has the information that they may constitute evidence in the proceedings - then the storage period is extended until valid termination of the proceedings.
8. Due to the specificity of monitoring, it is not possible to refuse to provide data while being in the monitored area. The data obtained as part of the monitoring will not be used for automated decision making, including profiling.



§ 15

Regulations concerning the sports venue – Football Stadium at Łazienkowska 3 Street, Warsaw are valid and binding from July 1, 2021.
